<u>Narrowleaf yerba santa (narrow-leafed mountain balm)</u>	<u>Eriodictyon angustifolium</u>	LV: simple, linear; ST: shrub
<u>Mountain bluebell (tall fringed bluebells, streamside bluebells, lungwort)</u>	<u>Mertensia ciliata</u>	FL: 5-lobed, tubular, blue/pink, raceme, drooping, 1/2-3/4", May-Aug; EC: edible-LV, FL

<u>Comfrey</u>	<u>Symphytum officinale</u>	LV: alternate, sheath, whole, oblong, entire, apex obtuse, base obtuse, >1", pubescent; FL: 5 parts, connate, reflexed, blue/red/white, raceme, terminal, drooping, clustered, <1", spring;/summer, stamen longer than petals; ST: herb, >1', erect, grooved, pubescent; EC: waste places
